63-01059, Keyrock Environment LLC, P.O. Box 2223, Johnson City, TN 37605, North Bethlehem Township, Washington County. Application received: December 3, 2021.

In accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.424 and 127.425, the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has received an application and is providing notice that it intends to issue an initial natural minor State-Only Operating Permit for the Keyrock Environment, LLC Mine 84 Weir site located at 40° 8` 6.07" N, 80° 6` 11.17" W. Sources of emissions consist of three (3) 18.4 MMBtu/hr Aeron AB-200 enclosed flares. Potential emissions from this facility are estimated to be 19.4 TPY NO_x, 24.2 TPY CO, < 0.1 TPY VOC, < 0.1 TPY total HAP, 1.1 TPY PM, 1.0 TPY PM-10, 1.0 TPY PM-2.5, and 25,407 TPY CO₂e.

Those who wish to provide the Department with additional written information that they believe should be considered prior to the issuance of the natural minor State-Only Operating Permit may submit the information to Tom Joseph, Facilities Permit Chief, Department of Environmental Protection, Southwest Regional Office, 400 Waterfront Drive, Pittsburgh, PA 15222. Written comments must contain the name, address and telephone number of the person submitting the comments, identification of the proposed Operating

Permit (63-01059) and concise statements regarding the relevancy of the information or objections to issuance of the Operating Permit.

A public hearing may be held, if the Department, in its discretion, decides that such a hearing is warranted based on the information received. All persons submitting comments or requesting a hearing will be notified of the decision to hold a hearing by publication in the newspaper or by the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, or by telephone, where the Department determines such notification by telephone is sufficient. Written comments or requests for a public hearing should be directed to Tom Joseph, Facilities Permit Chief, at the previously listed address.

All comments must be received prior to the close of business 30 days after the date of this publication.

The applicant proposes to: Operate and maintain a previously installed 210-foot-long 48" corrugated metal in an unnamed tributary of Froman Run (WWF), for the purpose of replacing an existing 24" pipe that was collapsed and clogged with sediment. The project site is located at the intersection of Airport Road and Lake Drive. Latitude: 40.235250°, Longitude: -80.001617°.

The applicant has been given consent to: 1. Construct and maintain a new concrete junction box within an existing 370 LF 84-inch diameter stream enclosure which conveys flow to a UNT to Little Chartiers Creek, HQ-WWF (STR1); 2. Construct and maintain two new stormwater inlets within the parking area which conveys to the aforementioned stream enclosure; 3. Remove 236 LF of another 24-inch diameter stream enclosure which conveys flow of another UNT (STR2) to the aforementioned UNT to Little Chartiers Creek, and to construct and maintain a replacement 565 LF, 24-inch diameter concrete stream enclosure which will reroute STR2 to the aforementioned new junction box. 4. Temporarily reroute 418 LF (STR1) and 260 LF (SRT2) of existing stream flow through two stream pump bypasses during construction. For the purpose of constructing a new Public Safety Building which will

include a new fire station, municipal office space, parking lot, drainage collection system and stormwater management for the site. The project will cumulatively and permanently impact 246 LF of existing enclosed watercourses and 0.01 acre of floodway. Temporary impacts include 678 LF of watercourse and 0.05 acre of floodway. Pursuant to the Pennsylvania Clean Streams Law, The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Rules and Regulations, the Surface Mining Conservation and Reclamation Act, and the Bituminous Mine Subsidence and Land Conservation Act as amended, notice is hereby given that Tunnel Ridge, LLC, 184 Schoolhouse Lane, Valley Grove WV 26060 is making application to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection to revise Coal Mining Activity Permit (CMAP) No. 63091301 for Tunnel Ridge Mine. This permit application is to revise 1,155.75 acres of the underground and subsidence control plan boundaries from development mining only to longwall mining. The proposed revision area is in Donegal Township, Washington County, and can be found on portions of the Claysville, PA and Valley Grove, WV U.S. Geological Survey 7.5 minute topographic maps as well as mapping provided in the permit application. This area can be described as follows: The permit and subsidence control plan revision area begins at a point 1,170 FT northeast of the intersection of Greaves RD and Old Brick RD then 3,400 FT northeast to a point 1,400 FT northeast of the intersection of Waynesburg RD and Old National RD then 3,020 FT northeast to a point 2,040 FT northeast of the intersection of Tunnel Street and State Route 40 then 7,015 FT southeast to a point 2,590 FT southwest of the intersection of Old National Pike and Willhelm Valley RD then 5,952 FT southwest to a point 2,103 FT west of the intersection of Waynesburg RD and Tollgate RD then 9,173 FT northwest to the point of origin. All distances and headings are approximate.

The proposed revision requests approval to perform minor forms of stream restoration as necessary for streams located within the proposed revision area. If necessary, restoration plans will be evaluated with the PADEP and restoration plans will be implemented for minor forms of stream restoration.
