This small project joint permit application proposes to expose approximately 380 LF of one existing 12" HDPE combination (fresh/produced) and two (2) existing 10" steel gas pipelines through Regulated Waters of the Commonwealth in preparation for longwall mining activities under these pipelines. Exposure of Pipeline exposure is anticipated to last approximately one (1) year and will result in temporary impacts to one (1) stream and two (2) associated stream floodways (UNTs to Bates Fork, a High-Quality Warm Waters Fishery). Total proposed earth disturbance for this project is 27.8 acres. Pursuant to the Pennsylvania Clean Streams Law, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Rules and Regulations, the Surface Mining Conservation and Reclamation Act, and the Bituminous Mine Subsidence and Land Conservation Act as amended, notice is hereby given that Consol Pennsylvania Coal Company LLC, 275 Technology Drive, Suite 101, Canonsburg, PA 15317, has submitted an application to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection to revise Coal Mining Activity Permit No. 30121301 and related NPDES permit for the Harvey Mine.

The proposed revision adds approximately 20.8 acres of surface permit area for the construction of the 1N Bleeder Facility. The project is located in Center Township, Greene

County, Pennsylvania and is located on the Rogersville, PA U.S. Geological Survey 7.5 minute topographic map. The proposed permit area begins at an existing access road off of Boulder Road (T-485), approximately 0.2 miles northeast of the intersection of Boulder Road and Hopewell Ridge Road (T-565). It continues northeast along the access road for approximately 1580 feet at a width of 30 feet. It continues another 645 feet to the northeast, extending out along the road to the southeast approximately 1200 feet. The proposed permit revision includes construction of the airshaft, substation, ventilation air methane system, and boreholes. The proposed permit revision also includes access roads, a stockpile, cuttings pit, sediment pond, and other erosion and sedimentation control facilities.

The application includes a request for variance to encroach within 100 feet of the right-of-way of Boulder Road (T-485) beginning 0.2 miles northeast of its intersection with Hopewell Ridge Road (T-565) and continuing 290 feet to the northeast. The road variance is required for access to the site.

Stream variance requests are proposed for work within 100 feet of two unnamed tributaries to Browns Creek. A variance is requested for UNT 40540G-1 to Browns Creek, located at its headwaters, approximately 1690 feet north and 1970 feet east of the intersection of Boulder Road (T-485) and Hopewell Ridge Road (T-565) and continuing downstream to the southwest for 200 feet. Two sections of variance are requested for UNT 40540G to Browns Creek, the first located at its headwaters, approximately 2100 feet north and 1475 feet east of the intersection of Boulder Road and Hopewell Ridge Road and continuing downstream for approximately 345 feet, and the second beginning 500 feet downstream of the headwaters and continuing for approximately 150 feet downstream to the southeast. The variances are required for construction of the sediment pond, collection ditch, vegetated filter strip, sediment pond access road, access to the topsoil stockpile, and installation of erosion and sedimentation controls.

The proposed permit revision includes one new NPDES discharge point. The point is at the sediment pond emergency spillway outlet into an UNT to 40540G to Browns Creek located at 39o5522.1, 80o1702.6. Treated surface water runoff will be discharged at the new NPDES point.

Blasting may be conducted during site grading activities. Blasting will not occur until a plan has been approved by the PADEP. When a blasting schedule is finalized, residents, owners of dwellings or other structures, local governments and public utilities located within mile of the area where blasting will occur will be notified. All residents, owners of dwellings or other structures located within mile of the area where blasting will occur will be informed of their right to a pre-blast survey and how they may request such a survey.

The proposed revision adds approximately 23.7 acres of surface permit area for the installation of the 9 South 1 Powerline. The project is located in Morris Township and Center Township, Greene County, Pennsylvania and is located on the Rogersville, PA U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute topographic map. The proposed permit area begins at the proposed 9 South 1 Airshaft Facility, near the intersection of Hopewell Ridge Road (T-565) and Morris Run Road (T-416) and continues in a generally north/northeast direction for 1.3 miles. It will connect to the 7 North 1 Powerline, near the existing railroad off of McCollum Road (T-416). The permit width is 100 feet along the powerline. The proposed permit revision includes installation of a 1.3-mile-long overhead powerline, temporary access corridors, and erosion and sedimentation control facilities.

The application includes activities within 100 feet of the right-of-way of Patterson Creek Road (T-581) beginning approximately 0.4 miles west/northwest of its intersection with Morris Run Road (T-417) and continuing 355 feet northwest. The road variance is required for installation of the overhead powerline and temporary access off of the road.

Variances are proposed for the following four streams:

A variance is requested for work within 100 feet of UNT 40555 to Patterson Creek, beginning at a point approximately 955 feet north and 600 feet west of the intersection of Hopewell Ridge Road (T-565) and Morris Run Road (T-416) and continuing downstream for approximately 260 feet in a northerly direction. A variance is requested for work within 100 feet of UNT 40555-a to Patterson Creek, beginning near its confluence with UNT 40555 - approximately 1245 feet north and 450 feet west of the intersection of Hopewell Ridge Road and Morris Run Road. It continues approximately 400 feet upstream to the west. A 100 foot section of variance is requested for UNT 40554 to Patterson Creek, located along Patterson Creek Road (T-581) approximately 0.4 miles west/northwest of its intersection with Morris Run Road (T-417) and continuing upstream in a westerly direction.

RECLAMATION ACT, and the COAL REFUSE DISPOSAL CONTROL ACT as amended, notice is hereby given that Washington County Land Resources, Inc. (WCLR) doing business at 46226 National Road, St. Clairsville, Oh 43950, has made application to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection proposing the addition of 13.3 surface permit acres at CMAP No. 63723707 and the related NPDES permit for the Ginger Hill Refuse Area 11 coal refuse disposal facility. The additional surface acres are for the construction of a pipeline to transport treated mine water to the Monongahela River for discharge. The receiving streams for the existing permit are Dry Run and an Unnamed Tributary of Pigeon Creek. The acreage of CMAP No. 63723707 is 254.0 and the permit was issued on 09/5/1986 and expires on 9/4/2026.

The subject coal refuse disposal site is located in Washington County, Carroll and Nottingham Townships, and is situated on an unnamed tributary of Pigeon Creek, approximately 3 miles west of the City of Monongahela, Pennsylvania. The coal refuse disposal site can be found on the Monongahela U.S.G.S. 7 1/2 minute topographic map, at a location 2,900' southeast from the intersection of SR-917 and Crackerjack Road (SR-1067). The proposed surface acres begin on the east side of the existing permit and extends 2.7 miles to the proposed NPDES discharge point 001 (Lat:40-12-53, Long:79-57-38) at the confluence of the Monongahela River and Mingo Creek. Additionally, this application proposes a land use change from forestland to unmanaged natural habitat along the path of the pipeline. The land use change will affect approximately 5.9 acres of the 13.3 acres proposed in this application.

A road variance is requested for Ridge Road (T-599) beginning at a point approximately 3,160 feet east of the intersection of Ridge Road (T-599) and Dry Run Road (SR-136) and continuing east approximately 30 feet. The activities include the installation of a pipeline crossing Ridge Road.

A road variance is requested for Dry Run Road (SR-136) beginning at a point approximately 2,600 feet east of the intersection of Ridge Road (T-599) and Dry Run Road (SR-136) and continuing east approximately 30 feet. The activities include the installation of a pipeline as well as a pipeline boring under Ridge Road.

A road variance is requested for Gearing Road (T-854) beginning at the intersection of Gearing Road (T-854) and Dry Run Road (SR-136) and continuing north approximately 1,470 feet. The activities include the installation of a pipeline.

A stream variance is requested for Mingo Creek 39585 beginning at a point approximately 6,420 feet upstream of the intersection of Mingo Creek and the Monongahela River and continuing approximately

225 feet downstream. The activities include the installation of a pipeline as well as a pipeline boring under Mingo Creek. The total variance area is approximately 0.05 acres.

A stream variance is requested for Mingo Creek 39585 beginning at a point approximately 2,300 feet upstream of the intersection of Mingo Creek and the Monongahela River and continuing approximately 50 feet downstream. The activities include the installation of a pipeline within 100 feet of Mingo Creek. The total variance area is approximately 0.01 acres.

A stream variance is requested for Mingo Creek 39585 beginning at a point approximately 970 feet upstream of the intersection of Mingo Creek and the Monongahela River and continuing approximately 250 feet downstream. The activities include the installation of a pipeline within 100 feet of Mingo Creek. The total variance area is approximately 0.06 acres.
