Code §§ 127.424, 127.425, and 127.521, the Department is providing notice that it intends to issue a State Only Operating Permit renewal for the Rogersville Compressor Station in Center Township, Greene County. Equipment at this facility includes one (1) 83.4 bhp natural gas-fired emergency generator engine, one (1) 50 MMscfd triethylene glycol dehydration unit controlled by a 7.0 MMbtu/hr natural gas-fired enclosed ground flare, one (1) 0.77 MMBtu/hr natural gas-fired dehydration unit reboiler, one (1) 2,000-gallon produced water storage tank, one (1) 5.38 MMBtu/hr natural gas-fired glycol line heater, pneumatic devices, blowdown emissions, pigging operations, and fugitive emissions. Potential annual emissions from this facility are as follows: 5.74 tons NOx, 1.23 tons VOCs, and 5.67 tons CO, 0.42 ton PM₁₀, 0.42 ton PM_{2.5}, 0.18 ton SO₂, 0.11 ton HAPs, 0.05 ton methanol, and 8,524 tons CO₂e. The facility is subject to the applicable requirements of 25 Pa. Code Article III, Chapters 121—145. The emergency generator is subject to 40 CFR Part 60, Subpart JJJJ, Standards of Performance for Stationary Spark Ignition Internal Combustion Engines. The proposed operating permit includes emissions limitations, monitoring, work practice standards, reporting, and recordkeeping requirements for the facility. Pursuant to the Pennsylvania Clean Streams Law, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Rules and Regulations, the Surface Mining Conservation and Reclamation Act, and the Bituminous Mine Subsidence and Land Conservation Act as amended, notice is hereby given that Consol Pennsylvania Coal Company LLC, 275 Technology Drive, Suite 101, Canonsburg, PA 15317, has submitted an application to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection to revise Coal Mining Activity Permit No. 30121301 and related NPDES permit for the Harvey Mine. The proposed revision adds approximately 10.3 acres of surface permit area for the installation of the 2B Panel Degas Boreholes. The facilities will be located in Morris Township, Greene County, Pennsylvania and are located on the Rogersville PA U.S. Geological Survey 7.5 minute topographic map. The 2B-1 Borehole permit area is off of the existing access road off of Hopkins Run Road (T-478), which is located approximately 400 feet south of the intersection of Hopkins Run Road and Simpson Chapel Road (T-618). The permit begins approximately 0.5 miles southeast from the road entrance, then follows an existing driveway 2630 feet south where it intersects the 5B Powerline. It then continues to the south 450 feet. It varies in width from 40 feet to 240 feet. The 2B-2 Borehole permit area begins along the eastern side of Ross School Road (T-617), approximately one mile north of its intersection with SR 18. It continues to the north approximately 375 feet, varying in width between 55 and 190 feet. The 2B-3 Borehole permit area is located off of the existing EQT F lams Well Pad access road, approximately 0.8 miles south/southwest from its intersection with Hopkins Run Road. It extends to the south/southwest along the field line for approximately 1900 feet, then turns 360 feet southeast, and then 500 feet northeast. It varies in width between 45 and 210 feet. The proposed permit revision includes construction of three degas boreholes, access roads, soil stockpiles, and erosion and sedimentation control facilities.

The application includes a request for variance to encroach within 100 feet of the right-of-way of Ross School Road (T-617), beginning approximately 1.0 miles north of its intersection with SR 18 (Browns Creek Road) and continuing approximately 375 feet to the north. The variance is required for an access road, borehole pad construction, borehole installation, a soil stockpile, and erosion and sedimentation control facilities.

Stream variance requests are proposed for work within 100 feet of five unnamed tributaries to Browns Creek: at the headwaters of UNT 40539-L7b located approximately 5340 feet north and 1595 feet east of the intersection of Hopkins Run Road (T-478) and SR 18 and continuing downstream to the west for 15 feet; UNT 40542 beginning approximately one mile north along Ross School Road (T-617) from its intersection with SR 18 and continuing 390 feet upstream to the north; UNT 40542-R5 located approximately one mile north along Ross School Road from its intersection with SR 18 and extending east its entire 75 foot length downstream of the culvert under Ross School Road; 125 feet of UNT 40542-R5a located west of the culvert under Ross School Road approximately one mile north from its intersection with SR 18; a 75 foot section of UNT 40545-S03, located at its headwaters, 1630 feet south and 4365 feet west of the intersection of Hopkins Run Road and Ross School Road. The stream variances are required for access to the sites, borehole pad grading, borehole installation, a topsoil stockpile, and erosion and sedimentation control facility installation.
