Project Description: The project will involve **constructing a new overhead electric utility line from the existing Dutch Fork-Washington 138kV line to the newly constructed MPLX natural gas compressor facility at Timber Lake Rd (T-488).** A temporary gravel laydown area located off Sunset Beach Rd (SR 3009) is also proposed for this project.

Special Conditions: 1. This permit does not authorize any obstructions or encroachments to any regulated watercourse or floodway. All permitting required for impacts to regulated watercourses or their floodway are subject to 25 Pa. Code Chapter 105. Appropriate authorization for impacts which require permitting under Chapter 105 must be obtained prior to beginning earth disturbance.

Description This project involves proposed improvements at Pennsylvania American Water

Company (PAWC) E.H. Aldrich Water Treatment Plant—the Chemical System Improvements Project. Improvements will be made to the zinc orthophosphate, fluorosilicic acid, ferric chloride, caustic soda, and nonionic polymer systems. Meter pumps, associated piping and valves, storage tanks with level sensors are being replaced. In addition, the installation of a 60-gallon hot water heater is proposed and a water softening system for the caustic soda chase water. The project includes the removal of one emergency shower/eye wash and the installation of two

new emergency shower/eye wash stations at the facility. This includes the installation of a 120-gallon hot water heater with tempering valve and flow switch alarms that go to SCADA. Tempered water will also be supplied to an emergency shower/eye wash station at the truck unloading station.

The project is located in Washington Township, Greene County, Pennsylvania and is located on the Waynesburg, PA US Geological Survey 7.5 minute topographic map. The proposed permit area begins at an existing driveway off of SR 4031 (Dillie Road). It continues along the existing driveway approximately 870 feet to the northwest, extending to the northeast of the driveway at a width varying between 210 and 765 feet. The permit continues to the north for approximately 930 feet and then northwest/west for 400 feet at a width of approximately 80 feet. Code 127.424, 127.425 and 127.521, the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is providing notice that it intends to issue a Title V Operating Permit renewal to Arden Landfill, Inc. for their facility located in Chartiers Township, Washington County Arden Landfill, Inc., a municipal solid waste landfill has been in operation since 1977. Sources and the control devices at this facility include Landfill Operations, Paved and Unpaved Roads, six (6) 1148 Caterpillar 3516 landfill gas-fired internal combustion engines, Landfill Fugitive emissions (fugitive gas, material handling, & erosion), Diesel Emergency Generators, Degreasing Units, Primary Ground Flare (Enclosed Flare), Backup Flare (Candle), and Water Truck.

This facility has the potential emissions per year of the following type and quantity of air contaminants: 276.37 tons of carbon monoxide, 136.73 tons of nitrogen oxides, 89.14 tons of particulate matter, 55.14 tons of sulfur oxides, 56.92 tons of volatile organic compounds and 40.35 tons of HAPS.

The proposed TVOP contains emission restriction, testing, monitoring, recordkeeping, reporting and work practice standards derived from the applicable requirements of PA Code Title 25, Article III, Chapters 121 through 145, 40 CFR Part 62 Subpart 000, 40 CFR Part 63 Subpart AAAA, 40 CFR Part 60 Subpart Cf, 40 CFR Part 60 Subpart 000 and 40 CFR Part 63 Subpart ZZZZ.

A person may oppose the proposed Title V Operating Permit by filing a written protest with the Department through Noor Nahar via mail to Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, 400 Waterfront Drive, Pittsburgh, PA 15222. Each protest or set of written comments must contain the name, address and telephone number of the person submitting the comments, identification of the proposed Title V Operating Permit (63-00549) and a concise statement of the objections to the Operating Permit issuance and the relevant facts upon which the objections are based.

The application, DEP's Review Memorandum, and the proposed permit are available for public review during normal business hours at DEP's Southwest Regional Office, 400 Waterfront Drive, Pittsburgh PA 15222. A file
