Approval of a Title V Operating Permit Renewal and Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT III) plan for Flexsys America, LP Monongahela Plant located in Carroll Township, Washington County.

In accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.424, 127.425 and 127.521, the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) is providing notice that it intends to issue a renewal Title V operating permit (TV-63-00015) to Flexsys America, LP which also incorporates RACT III requirements.

The following sources and control devices at this facility are addressed in this RACT III proposal:

The facility has potential emissions of 44.63 TPY NOx; 23.26 TPY CO; 2.20 TPY PM10, 45.80 TPY SOx; 102.82 TPY VOC; 84.49 TPY CS2; 3.70 TPY H2S; and 42,675 TPY CO2e. Emission limitations, operating requirements, and work practice standards along with monitoring, recordkeeping, and reporting requirements have been included in this proposed revision to the Title V operating permit to ensure that the facility complies with applicable Federal and State air quality regulations.

Furthermore, in accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 129.111—129.115, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection has made a preliminary determination to approve a RACT III plan and an amendment to the State Implementation Plan (SIP) for the aforementioned facility. The facility is not subject to any RACT III requirements for NOx.

The proposed SIP revision does not adopt any new regulations. It incorporates the provisions and requirements contained in the amended RACT III approval for the facility, which are intended to satisfy the requirements for the 1997, 2008, and 2015 National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for ozone.

The proposed amendments to the RACT III determination, if finally approved, will be incorporated into a revised renewal operating permit TV-63-00015 for the facility. The relevant RACT III requirements will be submitted to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as a revision to Pennsylvania's State Implementation Plan and will remain in effect until replaced pursuant to 40 CFR 51 and approval by the EPA. Requirements that are not part of the RACT III determination will be excluded from the SIP submittal.

The Fletcher Run evaluation is being conducted in response to a rulemaking petition submitted to the Environmental Quality Board (EQB) by Consol Pennsylvania Coal Company, LLC. On March 12, 2024, the EQB accepted the rulemaking petition for study under 25 Pa. Code Chapter 23 (relating to Environmental Quality Board Policy for processing petitions—statement of policy). Under 25 Pa. Code § 93.9v (relating to Drainage List V), the Fletcher Run basin is currently designated HQ-WWF. The petitioner is requesting the basin be redesignated to WWF.

The petition is available on the Department's web site at www.dep.pa.gov (select "Public Participation," then "Environmental Quality Board," then "2024 Meetings" and look for the March 12, 2024, meeting materials) or by contacting the Environmental Quality Board, P.O. The proposed revision adds approximately 17.1 acres of surface permit area for the installation of the H7 Bleeder Facility. The project is located **in Washington Township**, **Greene County**, Pennsylvania and is located on the Waynesburg, PA US Geological Survey 7.5 minute topographic map. The proposed permit area begins at an existing driveway off of SR 4031 (Dillie Road). It continues along the existing driveway approximately 870 feet to the northwest, extending to the northeast of the driveway at a width varying between 210 and 765 feet. The permit continues to the north for approximately 930 feet and then northwest/west for 400 feet at a width of approximately 80 feet. It then continues southwest for 325 feet and extends to the south at a width of approximately 350 feet. The proposed permit revision includes construction of the airshaft, substation, and boreholes. The proposed permit revision also includes access roads, a stockpile, cuttings pit, sediment trap, and other erosion and sedimentation control facilities.

The application includes a request for variance to encroach within 100 feet of the right-of-way of SR 4031 (Dillie Road) beginning 0.6 miles southwest of its intersection with Pettit Road (T-409) and continuing approximately 270 feet to the southwest. The road variance is required for access to the site utilizing an existing driveway, access road construction, and erosion and sedimentation control facilities.

Stream variance requests are proposed for work within 100 feet of two streams as follows: Dille Run (40516) for 160 feet downstream and 200 feet upstream on either side of the culvert under SR 4031 (Dillie Road), which is approximately 0.6 miles southwest of the intersection of SR 4031

with Pettit Road; and a variance along 930 feet of UNT 40519 to Dille Run from its culvert under SR 4031 and continuing upstream along the existing driveway. The variances are required for access to the site, construction of the sediment trap, collection ditches, level spreader, cuttings pit fill outslopes, and installation of erosion and sedimentation controls.
