in Canonsburg Borough, Washington County. In accordance with 25 Pa. Code §§ 127.424 and 127.425, the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has received an application and is providing notice that it intends to issue a new, facility-wide, State Only Operating Permit for the facility previously mentioned. Sources of emissions and control at the site consist of one (1) 150 lbs/hr Matthews IE43-PPI (Power Pak I) human crematory incinerator, and one (1) IE43-PPI Secondary Chamber. Facility-wide potential emissions are estimated at 0.58 ton NO<sub>x</sub>, 0.48 ton CO, 0.36 ton SO<sub>x</sub>, 0.1 ton VOC, 0.76 ton PM<sub>10</sub>, and 0.17 ton HAPs. At a minimum, the facility is required to conduct daily surveys of the site to ensure compliance with visible, fugitive, and malodor emission requirements and maintain records of those surveys. The air quality permit includes emission limitations, work practice standards, monitoring requirements, recordkeeping, and reporting requirements for the site. Those who wish to provide the Department with additional written information that they believe should be considered prior to the issuance of the Natural Minor State-Only Operating Permit may submit the information to Tom Joseph, Environmental Engineering Manager, Department of Environmental Protection, Southwest Regional Office, 400 Waterfront Drive, Pittsburgh, PA 15222. #### Enlow Fork Mine

Pursuant to the Pennsylvania Clean Streams Law, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Rules and Regulations, the Surface Mining Conservation and Reclamation Act, and the Bituminous Mine Subsidence and Land Conservation Act as amended, notice is hereby given that Consol Pennsylvania Coal Company LLC, 275 Technology Drive, Suite 101, Canonsburg, PA 15317, has submitted an application to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection to revise Coal Mining Activity Permit No. 30841317 and related NPDES permit for the Enlow Fork Mine.

The proposed revision adds approximately 17.7 acres of surface permit area for the installation of the G5 Panel Degas Boreholes. The facilities will be located in Morris Township, Washington County, Pennsylvania and are located on the Prosperity, PA U.S. Geological Survey 7.5 minute topographic map. The G5-1 Borehole permit area begins 0.4 miles west of the intersection of Beulah Ridge Road (T-398) and SR 4019 (Andrews Road). It continues north along an existing driveway for approximately 1580 feet varying in width between 60 and 80 feet. It then extends northwest 330 feet, then northeast 910 feet, then west 800 feet, varying in width between 120 and 200 feet. It includes both the G5-1A and G5-1B boreholes. The G5-2 Borehole permit area begins along SR 3041 (Cash Day Road), 0.4 miles north of its intersection with SR 4019 and extends to the southwest approximately 970 feet, varying in width between 130 and 245 feet. The G5-3 Borehole permit begins along Parcell Road (T-424) approximately 200 feet west of its intersection with Auld Hill Road (T-420). It continues to the north for 610 feet at a width of 120 feet, then extends northeast 480 feet, varying in width between 120 and 300 feet. The proposed permit revision includes construction of four degas boreholes, access roads, soil stockpiles, and erosion and sedimentation control facilities.

The application includes a request for variance to encroach within 100 feet of the right-of-way of the following roads: Beulah Ridge Road (T-398) beginning approximately 0.4 miles west of its

intersection with SR 4019 (Andrews Road) and continuing 100 feet west; SR 3041 (Cash Day Road) beginning 0.4 miles north of its intersection with SR 4019 and continuing 145 feet northwest; and Parcell Road (T-424) beginning 200 feet west of its intersection with Auld Hill Road (T-420) and continuing 120 feet west. The road variances are required for access for the boreholes and erosion and sedimentation control facility installation.

A stream variance request is proposed for work within 100 feet of unnamed tributary 40926 to Lick Run, located approximately 1480 feet north of the intersection of SR 3041 (Cash Day Road) and SR 4019 (Andrews Road) and continuing 375 feet upstream in a southwesterly direction. The stream variance is required for installation of the G5-2 borehole pad, topsoil stockpile, and erosion and sedimentation control facilities.

The proposed revision area is in Aleppo and Springhill Townships, Greene County, and can be found on portions of the Cameron, <u>W.Va</u>. and New Freeport, Pa. U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute topographic maps as well as mapping provided in the permit application. This area can be described as follows:

The permit and subsidence control plan revision area begins at a point 4,770 FT northwest of the intersection of Palmer Road and Quiet Dell Road, then 12,595 FT southeast to a point 1,920 FT northwest of the intersection of Morford Road and Jobes Run Road, then 7,815 FT southeast to a point 2,027 FT southeast to the intersection of Mt. Pursuant to the Pennsylvania Clean Streams Law, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Rules and Regulations, the Surface Mining Conservation and Reclamation Act, and the Bituminous Mine Subsidence and Land Conservation Act as amended, notice is hereby given that Consol Pennsylvania Coal Company LLC, 275 Technology Drive, Canonsburg, PA 15317, has submitted an application to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection to revise Coal Mining Activity Permit (CMAP) No. 30841316 and related NPDES permit for the Bailey Mine.

The proposed revision adds approximately 24.9 acres of surface permit area for the installation of the M Bleeder Powerline and Waterline. The project is located in Richhill and Center Townships, Greene County, Pennsylvania and is located on the Wind Ridge and Rogersville, PA U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute topographic maps. The proposed permit area begins at the proposed M Bleeder Facility, off of Claylick Run Road (SR 3022) and continues in a general westerly direction for 0.7 miles. It then turns and continues northwest for approximately 0.5 miles. It will connect to the powerline at the existing 1L Bleeder shaft facility off of Shelleby Road (T-394). The permit width varies between 100 feet and 650 feet along the powerline. The proposed permit revision includes installation of a 1.5-mile-long overhead powerline, a 1.7 mile long waterline, and erosion and sedimentation control facilities.

The application includes activities within 100 feet of the right-of-way of the following two roads: Shelleby Road (T394) beginning approximately 0.2 miles north of its intersection with Pettit Road (T-388) and continuing approximately 530 feet northeast; and Pettit Road (T-388/T-527) beginning approximately 0.4 miles northeast of its intersection with Shelleby Road and continuing approximately 735 feet northeast. The road variances are required for installation of the overhead powerline, waterline installation, and access off of the roads.
