The proposed revision adds approximately 52.6 acres of surface permit area for the installation of the 15L Powerline. The project is located in Aleppo, Jackson, and Richhill Townships, Greene County, Pennsylvania and is located on the New Freeport, PA U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute topographic map. The proposed permit area begins at the proposed 15L Bleeder Facility, near the intersection of SR 3005 (Long Run Road), Blacks Creek Road, and Stahl Road and continues in a general northeasterly direction for 3.2 miles. It will connect to the powerline at the existing 7L Bleeder shaft facility off of SR 3005. The permit width varies between 100 feet and 600 feet along the powerline. The proposed permit revision includes installation of a 3.2-mile-long overhead powerline and erosion and sedimentation control facilities.

The application includes activities within 100 feet of the right-of-way of the following two roads: Harkins Road (T449) beginning approximately 0.5 miles southeast of its intersection with SR 3005 (Long Run Road) and continuing approximately 110 feet southeast; and SR 3005 (Long Run Road) beginning approximately 0.8 miles south of its intersection with Harkins Road (T-449) and continuing approximately 80 feet south. The road variances are required for installation of the overhead powerline and access of off the roads.

Variances are proposed for the following two streams: two sections of variance for work within 100 feet of UNT 32615 to Long Run the first beginning approximately 3115 feet north and 1700 feet east of the intersection of SR 3005 (Long Run Road) and Blacks Creek Road (T-356) and continuing 115 feet downstream in a northerly direction; and the second beginning at the culvert under Long Run Road, approximately 4175 feet north and 1260 feet east of its intersection with Blacks Creek Road and continuing upstream 585 feet to the southeast. The proposed permit revision is for changing the length of the West Greene District Long Wall Panels LW-76 through LW-79 located within the approved Cumberland Mine underground permit area and underground subsidence control plan area. The proposed revision area is located in Center and Jackson Townships, Greene County, south-southwest of Waynesburg, Pennsylvania and can be found on the Holbrook, Pennsylvania 7.5-minute U.S. Geological Survey topographic map.

The approved West Greene District for long wall mining encompasses approximately 2,855 acres and is rectangular in shape. The northern border begins at a point approximately 1 mile northwest of the intersection of Hoges Run Road and Golden Oaks Road (SR-18). The northern border continues in a southeastern direction for approximately 3.13 miles. The eastern border begins at a point approximately 0.74 mile east of the intersection of Center Highlands Road (T434) and Hargus Creek Road (SR-3011). The border then turns to the

southwest and continues for approximately 1.46 miles. The southern border begins at a point approximately 0.66 mile west-northwest of the intersection of Turkey Hollow Road and Iron Rock Road (T457). The southern border then turns to the northwest and continues for approximately 3.13 miles. The western border begins at a point approximately 0.26 mile southwest of the intersection of Macedonia Road and Bristoria Road (SR-3020). The western border continues northeast approximately 1.44 miles back to the place of origin.

Subsidence modeling has been conducted to estimate the location and extent of stream pooling that may be caused due to potential grade changes associated with long wall mining for Garner Run, Hoge Run, House Run, McCourtney Run and Hargus Creek overlying Panels LW-76 through LW-79 of the Cumberland Mine West Greene District. Nine (9) stream segments were identified as potentially exhibiting pooling at or greater than one (1) foot and therefore may require post-mining stream restoration activities. Eight (8) restoration areas have been identified to eliminate the nine (9) proposed pooling areas should they occur at the time of undermining. The location of the proposed stream restoration areas is as follows:

Potential restoration area GAR RA1 is located east of Golden Oaks Road (SR-18), on Garner Run (40643). The proposed restoration area begins approximately 776 feet south of the intersection of Golden Oaks Road (SR-18) and Bristoria Road (SR-3020) and continues southwest approximately 720 feet along Golden Oaks Road (SR-18).
