Pursuant to the Pennsylvania Clean Streams Law, the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection Rules and Regulations, the Surface Mining Conservation and Reclamation Act, and the Bituminous Mine Subsidence and Land Conservation Act as amended, notice is hereby given that Consol Pennsylvania Coal Company LLC, 275 Technology Drive, Suite 101, Canonsburg, PA 15317, has submitted an application to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection to revise Coal Mining Activity Permit No. 30121301 for the Harvey Mine.

The proposed revision adds approximately 13.2 acres of surface permit area for the installation of the 1N Panel Degas Boreholes. The facilities will be located in Center Township, Greene County, Pennsylvania and are located on the Rogersville, PA U.S. Geological Survey 7.5 minute topographic map. The 1N-1 borehole permit begins along Boulder Road (T-485) approximately 0.8 miles southwest of the intersection with SR 18. It extends southeast approximately 470 feet, then northwest 615 feet, varying in width between 120 feet and 270 feet. The 1N-2 borehole permit area begins off of SR 4017 (West Run Road) at the existing Equitrans Europa Compressor Station access road, approximately 0.4 miles northeast of the intersection with Hopewell Ridge Road. It continues along the access road and through the compressor station site at a width of approximately 30 feet. It then continues to the northeast approximately 715 feet, then southeast 1325 feet, varying in width between 65 and 300 feet. The 1N-3 borehole permit area begins at an existing driveway off of SR 4017, approximately 0.7 miles northeast of its intersection with Hopewell Ridge Road. It continues along the driveway approximately 650 feet and varies in width between 85 feet and 225. The proposed permit revision includes construction of three degas boreholes, access roads, soil stockpiles, and erosion and sedimentation control facilities.

The application includes a request for variance to encroach within 100 feet of the right-of-way of the following two roads: SR 4017 (West Run Road) at two locations - the first beginning 0.4 miles northeast of its intersection with Hopewell Ridge Road and continuing approximately 175 feet to the north, and the second beginning 0.7 miles northeast of the intersection and continuing 115 feet northeast; and Boulder Road (T-485) beginning 0.8 miles southwest of its intersection with SR 18 and continuing 255 feet to the southwest. The road variances are required for site access and erosion and sedimentation controls.

Stream variances are requested for work within 100 feet of four streams as follows: a 65 foot section of UNT 40543E to Browns Creek, located at its culvert under Boulder Road (T-485) approximately 0.8 miles southwest of the intersection with SR 18 and continuing downstream to the northwest; at the headwaters of UNT 40546A to Browns Creek, located at a point 1050 feet east and 1990 feet north of the intersection of SR 4017 (West Run Road) and Hopewell Ridge Road and continuing downstream for approximately 95 feet north of the intersection of SR 4017 and Hopewell Ridge Road and continuing upstream for approximately 350 feet northeast; and UNT 40546F to Browns Creek, located at its culvert under SR 4017 approximately 0.7 miles northeast of the intersection with Hopewell Ridge Road and continuing downstream 162 feet to the east to its confluence with UNT 40546.

The stream variances are required for site access and erosion and sedimentation control facility installation.
