Line Gibraltar pipe exposure construction is proposing to temporarily impact approximately 87 feet of a tributary to Middle Wheeling Creek (WWF) (UNT 5) and 0.26 acre of associated floodway; 0.15 acre of associated floodway of two tributaries to Middle Wheeling Creek (WWF) (UNT 3 and UNT 4), and 0.01 acre of a PEM (Other) wetlands for the long wall mining mitigation. The proposed revision adds approximately 13.2 acres of surface permit area for the installation of the 1M Panel Degas Boreholes. The facilities will be located in Center and Ricchhill Townships, Greene County, Pennsylvania and are located on the Rogersville and Wind Ridge, PA U.S. Geological Survey 7.5 minute topographic maps. The 1M-2 borehole permit area begins along Pettit Road (T-527) at the CNX Gas well GH58 Pad access road entrance. It continues along the existing access road to the south and southeast for approximately 1450 feet and varies in width between 40 and 290 feet. The 1M-3 borehole permit area begins off of Pettit Road, 0.6 miles northeast of its intersection with Shelleby Road (T-394). It continues to the northwest 820 feet and then to the north 1080 feet, varying in width between 60 feet and 270 feet. The 1M-4 borehole permit area begins along Jones Road, 0.2 miles east of its intersection with SR 3007 (Whitethorn Run Road) and continues along the road 535 feet to the east. It extends to the south of the road, varying in width between 100 and 210 feet. The proposed permit revision includes construction of four degas boreholes, access roads, soil stockpiles, and erosion and sedimentation control facilities. The 1M-1 borehole is located within existing permit areas.

The application includes a request for variance to encroach within 100 feet of the right-of-way of the following two public roads: Jones Road (T-533) beginning approximately 0.2 miles east of its intersection with Whitethorn Run Road (SR 3007) and continuing approximately 535 feet west; and Pettit Road (T-527) in two locations the first beginning approximately 0.6 miles northeast of its intersection with Shelleby Road (T-394) and continuing approximately 105 feet northeast, and the second beginning 1.3 miles northeast of its intersection with Shelleby Road and continuing approximately 190 feet southeast. The road variances are required for site access, pad construction, borehole installation, a soil stockpile, and erosion and sedimentation controls for the borehole facilities.

The facility consists of three (3) 4,735-bhp compressor engines, one (1) 16,301-bhp compressor turbines, one (1) 690-bhp emergency generator, four (4) natural gas-fired heaters/reboilers (totaling 1.41 MMBtu/hr), one (1) 10,000-gal condensate tank, one (1) 41.0 MMSCFD dehydration unit (controlled by flare), various fugitive emission sources, venting/blowdown events, pneumatic devices, pigging operations and miscellaneous storage tanks/vessels.

Potential emissions from the sources covered under this Title V operating permit are 103.04 TPY NO<sub>x</sub>, 24.59 TPY CO, 36.35 TPY VOC, 9.85 TPY total HAP, 7.20 TPY HCHO, 2.10 TPY SO<sub>x</sub>, 14.65 TPY PM-10, 14.65 TPY PM-2.5, and 145,167 TPY CO<sub>2e</sub>. Emission limitations, operating requirements, and work practice standards along with monitoring, recordkeeping, and reporting requirements have been included in this proposed Title V operating permit to ensure that the facility complies with applicable Federal and State air quality regulations.

A public hearing may be held, if the Department, in its discretion, decides that such a hearing is warranted based on the information received. All persons submitting comments or requesting a hearing will be notified of the decision to hold a hearing by publication in the newspaper or by the Pennsylvania Bulletin, or by telephone, where the Department determines such notification by telephone is sufficient. All comments must be received within 30 days after the date of this publication.
